Advising

We are serious about student advising. Customized, interest-centered advising is offered to all first-year, transfer, and undeclared students. (If you're undeclared, you'll work with a professional staff advisor to connect you with the right major and faculty advisor.) Three-year bachelor's degree students have an additional advisor to help guide their accelerated progress.

New students have a primary faculty advisor, one who shares their interests or teaches one of their first semester classes. Every new student, declared major or not, also gets a secondary advisor. Access is at the center of our advising program – you'll be turning to your faculty advisor to talk, brainstorm, and find out about other student services.

All over campus, you'll meet faculty who want you to thrive here. Sure, college can be challenging sometimes, but you'll have lots of guides along the way.

Hartwick's Individual Student Program May Be Right for You

If you realize that existing majors will not satisfy your interests, you have the option of designing your own area of study through the Individual Student Program. Working with an advisor, you can combine courses from different programs to develop an individualized major that matches your interests.
