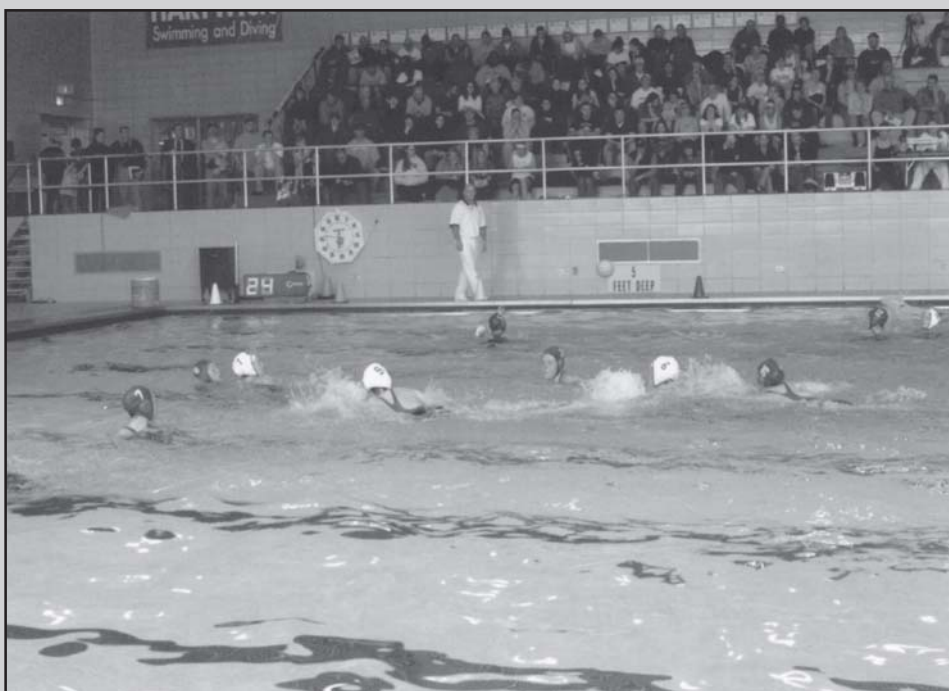

# Moyer Pool



The Hartwick College women's water polo team will have all of its home games and practices in Moyer Pool.

The pool, which is also home to the NCAA Division III men's and women's swimming and diving teams, is located in the Binder Physical Education Center on the Hartwick campus.

The water polo team earned their first victory at Moyer Pool with a 17-3 triumph over Marist College on October 13, 2000.

For swimming, Moyer Pool is an eight-lane, 25-yard facility. The eastern wall of the facility is constructed of glass from floor to ceiling, providing an impressive view of the Susquehanna River Valley and the Hartwick campus. There is seating for 500 fans on the west wall of the facility.

Two of Hartwick's closest and most devoted friends - Robert and Joan Moyer - were recognized on May 7, 1999 as the College dedicated the pool in honor of them and their family.

Members of the College and greater Oneonta community gathered poolside with the Moyers for the celebration. Bob Moyer was a member of the Hartwick Board of Trustees from 1977-86 and again from 1989-98. He was elected chair of the board in 1989, a position he held until 1996. As a board member, he chaired the finance committee and served on three other committees.

At Hartwick's commencement in 1998, Moyer received an honorary doctor of humane letters degree for his many years of service to the College. Joan Moyer was the 1989 recipient of the College's Citizens Board Outstanding Citizens Award.

Alan Huckins is entering his seventh season as head coach of the Hartwick College water polo program.

Under his guidance, the Hawks have qualified for the NCAA Championships three out of the last six seasons by winning the CWPA Eastern Division Championships. Huckins has posted a 177-63 mark at the helm of the program since his inaugural 2004 campaign.

Huckins has led Hartwick to 28 wins and berths in the final match of the CWPA Eastern Championships in each of the last two seasons. Huckins has now piloted Hartwick to 28 or more wins in each of his six seasons with the Hawks and has helped 'Wick extend its consecutive CWPA Northern title streak to nine.

In 2007, Hartwick registered a 32-10 overall mark, its second-consecutive Eastern Division title and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships at the US Olympic Training site in Los Alamitos, CA. The Hawks qualified for the tournament by downing Harvard (16-1), Indiana (15-7) and 18<sup>th</sup>-ranked Princeton (8-6) en route to another trip out west. After falling to third-ranked USC in opening round, the Hawks returned to down Pomona Pitzer (13-5) and rallied from an 8-0 deficit to down Loyola Marymount 13-12 to finish fifth overall. During the season, Hartwick posted a 14-game win streak between Feb. 17-Apr. 14

in which it outscored the opposition 185-71. The Hawks finished the year fourth in the nation in goals per game (12.2 gpg) and 13th in goals surrendered (7.4 gpg). Hartwick, which placed four players in the top 50 in the country in goal scoring, was led by Kirsten Hudson's 86 tallies on the year. The freshman, who missed six games as she represented New Zealand at the World Championships, garnered honorable mention All-America accolades, as well as being chosen the Eastern Division Rookie of the Year, the MVP of the Eastern Championships, and a first team all-Northern honoree.

In 2006, the Hawks captured their sixth-consecutive Collegiate Water Polo Association Northern Championship by defeating Harvard 10-4, and went on to defeat Michigan 11-8 in the CWPA Eastern Championship finale. That victory over the Wolverines earned the Hawks an automatic bid to the NCAA Championships, where they finished sixth. Hartwick finished the season 28-11 overall. Huckins coached then sophomore Bronwen Knox, a second team AWCPA All-American to a nation's leading 129 goals.

In 2005, Hartwick tallied a 28-9 overall mark and registered an unblemished 7-0 record in divisional play en route to the CWPA Northern Championship crown.

In his first season at the helm, Huckins guided the Hawks to a 33-10 record and an appearance in the 2004 NCAA tournament. 'Wick finished in fourth place behind national champion USC, sec-

second-place Loyola Marymount, and third-place Stanford.

During his tenure at Hartwick, Huckins has coached four players receiving All-America accolades. Sheri Johnson ('04), Kate Chambers ('05) and Bronwen Knox were all two-time American Water Polo Association All-America selections. Knox, the nation's leading goal scorer with 129 markers in 2006, left the Hawks following the 2006 season to train with the Australian National team in preparation for the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. Kirsten Hudson received AWPCA All-American Honorable Mention in each of the last two seasons.

Huckins, the 2005 and 2006 CWPA Northern Division Coach of the Year, spent the 2002-2003 academic year as head coach of the women's water polo team at Florida Atlantic University, where he recruited for what would have been the program's inaugural season in 2004. However, FAU decided to cut the program, which paved the way for Huckins to take over at Hartwick.

A 1992 graduate of Slippery Rock University, Huckins is an experienced coach on the international, collegiate, high school and club levels.

Huckins served an assistant coach for the United States Women's National Water Polo "A" Team from 1995-1998. He helped guide the team to a sixth-place finish at the FINA World Championships in January of 1998 in Perth, Australia. Huckins also worked as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National "B" Team from 1993-1995.

Before his arrival at Florida Atlantic, Huckins spent four years (1998-2002) doubling as the aquatics director and head coach of the men's and women's swimming and diving teams at The College of Saint Rose in Albany. In addition, he also served as head coach and president of the Adirondack Water Polo Club.

Huckins, a native of San Martin (CA) began coaching collegiate water polo as a graduate assistant at Slippery Rock, where he worked with the men's and women's teams during the 1992-1993 academic year. He left Slippery Rock after 18 months to accept the men's and women's head coaching position at Bucknell.

While at Bucknell, Huckins led the men's squad to a 20-10 record and was named 1993 CWPA Coach of the Year at the Eastern Championships. In 1994, he guided the women's team to a 20-4 record and was named CWPA Coach of the Year at the Eastern Championships.

Huckins, after his experiences at Bucknell and with the U.S. National "B" Team, moved back to California to coach the water polo and swimming and diving teams at Beyer High School from 1995-1997. In addition, he also coached the Modesto/Stanslaus Swimming and Water Polo Club teams.

He returned to the collegiate ranks in January of 1997, and spent 20 months as the co-head coach of the men's and women's teams at Slippery Rock.

A three-time All-American at Slippery Rock, Huckins has served five years (1993, '94, '97, '98, '03) on the NCAA Women's Water Polo Top 20 Committee.



### Assistant Coach Colleen Santos

Colleen Santos, a past four-year letterwinner for Hartwick, rejoined the program as the assistant coach prior to the 2007 season. In her fourth year with the Hawks, Santos will assist head coach Alan Huckins in all aspects of coaching and recruiting.

Santos, a native of Sanger, CA, lettered at Hartwick from 2001-04, where she played one year under Huckins. During her career, Santos was an integral part of the program's success. In 2004, she tallied 21 goals and 30 assists for a career-high 51 points in 38 games, as Hartwick made it to its first NCAA Division I Water Polo Championships, finishing fourth. Currently, she ranks sixth all-time in Hartwick history in career assists (91).

Following graduation, Santos spent two years as the head girls water polo coach at Sunnyside High School in Fresno, CA. In the spring of 2006, she also served a stint as an assistant swimming coach. Santos was a recognized name around the water polo circles in the Fresno Area. She coached one North Yosemite League MVP, two first team all-league performers, and two second team honorees. Santos guided her program to back-to-back postseason efforts, finishing no worse than fourth in league competition. She was named the 2005 NYL Coach of the Year after inheriting a program that went 9-20 and turned it around for a 23-8 effort in one year.

# 2010 Season Outlook

This season's version of the Hartwick College water polo team will enter the 2010 campaign as a hungry team with eyes on the program's fourth NCAA Tournament bid since 2004. The Hawks have come up one game short of qualifying for the national tournament in each of the last two seasons as they've fallen both times to arch rival Michigan in the CWPA Eastern finals. The two eastern powers are expected to be the last two teams standing once again this year with a few other programs vying for a spot in the championship.

The Hawks are loaded with talent this season as head coach Alan Huckins brings back all but graduating seniors Barbara Amaro and Stefani Toungate. In total, 12 of 14 players from last season's roster return, including the top four point producers and 10 of the top 11 goal scorers.

Seniors Kirsten Hudson and Christina Evans are two of the Hawks' top guns on the offensive side of the ball. They both return for their final campaign after stellar three-year careers.

Hudson is the only three-time All-

American at Hartwick and will finish her career as one of the most prolific scorers in the history of the NCAA. Last season, she scored 124 goals and assisted on 77 others for 201 points. It marked the only time in program history a player reached the 200-point mark in a single season. She has registered three of the top four single-season point totals in the 'Wick record books and owns career benchmarks for points (505), goals (314), and ranks 2nd in assists (191). Hudson also is tied for fourth all-time in steals (205), tied for 8th in kick-outs drawn (78), and holds the record for points in a game with 13 versus Brown on 4/12/08. She is a two-time CWPA North MVP and won the Most Valuable Player award for the second time in her career at the Eastern Championships in 2009 despite the fact that the Hawks did not win the trophy.

Evans was tied for second on the team behind Hudson in goals scored last year with 65 tallies. She also finished third on the team in points with 84. Evans ranks in the all-time top 10 at Hartwick in several offensive and defensive categories. Her 249 career points puts her 7th in the 'Wick record books and her 182 goals is tied for 5th with Megan Dahl Smith '08. She is also tied for 4th in Hartwick history in steals with 150, and tied for 10th in career 4/5-meter kick-outs drawn with five. Last season, she earned a spot on the CWPA Northern Division Second

Team for the first time in her career.

In addition to the two returning seniors, junior Jessica McKee also is back after a brilliant sophomore campaign. McKee became just the sixth All-American water polo player at Hartwick in 2009 after tallying 65 times with 44 assists for 109 points. Her point total was the 10th highest in a season at the College. Last year, McKee led the Hawks in kick-outs drawn (41) and 4/5-meter kick-outs drawn (7) and was 2nd in

points and goals, and 3rd in assists. In just two seasons at 'Wick, McKee ranks 5th in the record books for 4/5 meter kick-outs with 11 and 6th in career kick-outs drawn with 91. She was named to the CWPA Eastern Championships Second Team and was selected to All-CWPA Northern Division First Team in 2009.

Coach Huckins also welcomes back a quartet of solid sophomores who combined for 120 goals and 88 assists last season.

Shannon Leonard finished fourth on the team in total points with 68, scoring 21 goals and assisting on 47. She was second on the squad in both assists and steals (76), and third on the team in 5-meter kick-outs. On three separate oc-

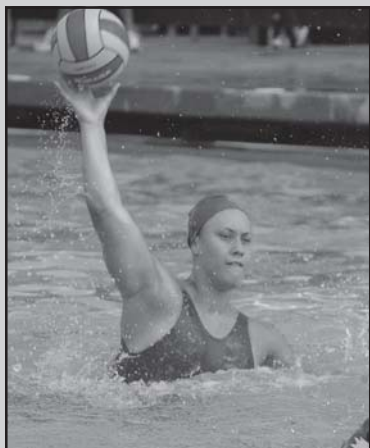

casions, Leonard was a CWPA Northern Division Rookie of the Week.

Sian Ells-Tewhiu had a productive

freshman season with 48 goals and 65 points. She twice scored five goals in a game, including in the CWPA Eastern quarterfinals against Harvard. Her 48 tallies was 4th in goals, 6th in points, and she

notched 32 steals and 13 kick-outs drawn. She garnered CWPA Northern Second Team honors and was a two-time Northern Rookie of the Week in her first season.

Allyssa Analytis and Lisa Bass combined for over 50 goals for Hartwick in 2009. Analytis tallied 31 times with 14 assists, and 34 steals. She was also a two-time divisional Rookie of the Week. Bass contributed 20 goals for the Hawks in her first season. Her 42 steals ranked fifth on the squad last year and she was the CWPA Northern Rookie of the Week on Feb. 3rd after scoring against #7 Arizona State and #13 Cal-Irvine in the opening weekend of the season.

Four juniors with experience also return for the Hawks, including center Adrienne Holosko, defender Sarah Johnson, and drivers Stephanie Abajian and Alyson Cannone.

Holosko scored 20 goals last season and has registered 32 for her career at 'Wick. She scored four times twice last season in a pair of Hawk wins.

Johnson set a career-best with four goals against Conn. College last season, and matched the feat just 15 days later against the Camels in the CWPA Northern playoffs.

Abajian has accumulated 15 goals and 12 assists in her two seasons with the program. Last year she had back-to-back five-goal games against Utica and Conn. College at Northerns.

Alyson Cannone notched three goals and three assists in her first season with the Hawks last year.

In goal, the Hawks are in good hands with junior Jess Dorman, who has already rewritten the Hartwick record books after her first two seasons. She has 807 saves with a program-best 410 in 2008 and another 397 last year. She was a second team pick at the CWPA Eastern Championships and was named to CWPA Northern Division Second Team a year ago. Dorman stopped a career-high 20 in the CWPA Eastern quarterfinals against Harvard in late April.

Eleven players will join the returning veterans on the squad. Goalie Hayley Cox, defenders Alice Denny, and Megan Clampitt, center Martina

hosted by UC San Diego and move on to the Roadrunner Invitational at Cal-Bakersfield from February 12-14.

Back on the east coast, 'Wick will play in the Princeton Invitational from February 20-21 before hosting one of its four home games against Siena on February 22. 'Wick has been virtually unbeatable at Moyer Pool in the last nine years. The Hawks, after losing their first home game back on March 4, 2001 to UMass, have since gone unbeaten in the last eight seasons, spanning 39 contests.

The Hawks try to defend their Elite Six Tournament Championship on March 6 and 7 as they take on the east's top teams in Bloomington, IN. Last season, 'Wick ran the table with victories over Michigan, Princeton, Maryland, and Bucknell to take the crown.

Hartwick then heads to Poughkeepsie to take part in the Marist Invitational from March 20-21. Following road games at Siena and Bucknell,

the Hawks open up CWPA Northern Division play at Moyer Pool. This season, two games apiece against Northern foes Brown and Harvard will determine the division champion rather than a post-season tournament. The Hawks host the Bears and the Crimson on April 10th and play both teams in Cambridge, MA a week later. Victories in the four matches would give the Hawks their 10th consecutive CWPA Northern Division title.

The Eastern playoffs take place in College Park, MD from April 30th to May 1st. The Hawks are looking to snap a two-year title drought after taking the top spot in 2004, 2006, and 2007. An Eastern title would ensure the Hawks' entry into the 2010 NCAA Tournament in San Diego, CA from May 14-16.

## 2009 In Review

Hartwick water polo ended the 2009 campaign in the CWPA Eastern Championship match for the second straight season. The Hawks, who finished the year with a national ranking of 14, won their ninth consecutive CWPA Northern Division title, won 15 consecutive matches, and finished unbeaten at the Elite Six Tournament, the Marist College Challenge, and the Cal-Bakersfield Tournament. The Hawks' 28 wins marks the sixth straight season the team has registered 28 or more victories.

'Wick kicked off the season on the west coast playing against some of the nation's best. Six of Hartwick's first seven contests were ranked in the national Top 20 including Arizona State (#7), UC Irvine (#13), USC (#1), UC San Diego (#19), San Diego State (#5), and Long Beach State (#15). After a loss to Long Beach on Feb. 7, the Hawks began their 15-game win streak with wins over Cal-Baptist, Marist, and #15 Cal-Bakersfield at the UCSD Triton Invite.

'Wick then took down #14 Michigan 9-7 in a rematch of the 2008 CWPA Eastern finals and downed Princeton, #20

Maryland, and Bucknell to take the top spot at the Elite Six tourney.

The Hawks continued to roll with five victories at the Marist Invitational. Over the course of the Blue and White's five games, the team racked up an astounding 93 goals. In the fourth game of the event, the Hawks set a program record for goals in a game with 25 against St.

Francis in a 25-9 win.

The streak finally came to end in the Hawks' second California trip as they took on four straight teams which were ranked in the Top 10. After opening with an 11-7 win over Pacific, Hartwick dropped contests to #6 Cal-Berkeley, #9 San Jose State, #4 Hawaii, and #3 UCLA. Wins over Cal-

San Bernadino (14-9) and Whittier (10-1) put 'Wick back into the win column before the team returned to campus.

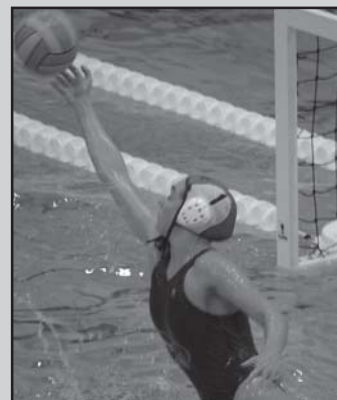
The Hawks received an unfriendly welcome back east in their opening game as CWPA North foe Brown handed 'Wick an 8-7 overtime loss in Wheaton, MA. It marked the first setback for the Hawks in the history of Northern Division play snapping a 92-game win streak.

It didn't take long for Hartwick to get back to its winning ways scoring 49 goals in three wins over Conn. College (16-3), Harvard (16-6), and Utica College (17-3) on Apr. 4.

After a 10-6 win over Marist at Moyer Pool, Hartwick challenged for its 9th divisional title in New London, CT. Hartwick beat out Harvard 12-8 to open up the tournament and downed Utica 15-3 entering the second day of play. The Hawks disposed of Conn. College 11-4 and secured the championship avenging the loss to Brown with an 11-7 win over the Bears.

In the Eastern playoffs, the Hawks drilled Harvard, 16-3, #19 Brown in the semi-finals, 10-6, and fell to Michigan in the finale for the second straight year.

Junior Kirsten Hudson was selected as

the Eastern Tournament MVP and was a first team all-Northern Division all-star. She became the first player in Hartwick history to break the 200-point mark in a single season, the first to eclipse the 500-point barrier in a career, and broke 'Wick records for points and goals over the course of the season. She was also a four-time Northern Division Player of the Week.

Keeper Jess Dorman, who set the single-season record for saves the previous year with 410, added another 399 stops this season to set the all-time save record at 'Wick. Dorman was also named to the Eastern Championships and CWPA Northern Division Second Team.

Sophomore Jessica McKee was named to the All-North First Team and the Eastern Second Team scoring 65 goals and 44 assists for 109 points on the year. It ranks as the 10th highest single-season point total in the history of the program.

'Wick freshmen were honored by the CWPA with weekly honors nine different times this season. Sian Ells-Tewhiu and Shannon Leonard each were named CWPA Northern Rookie of the Week three times. Allyssa Analytis earned the honor twice and Lisa Bass was tabbed once.

Junior Christina Evans was tied for second on the team in goals scored and was third in points. In the 'Wick career charts, she ranks in the top 10 in points, steals, and goals. Senior Barbara Amaro ranks in the top six in steals and assists in the Hawks' record book. She capped her career with 99 goals, 107 assists, and 185 steals in four seasons.

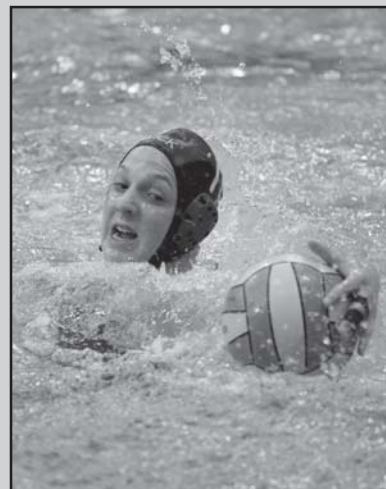

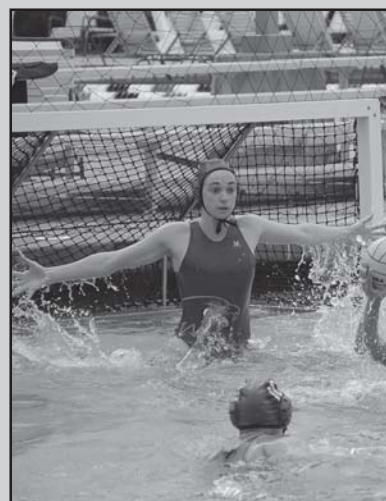

# All-Americans

## Megan Thomson

2001 AWPCA All-American (honorable mention)  
2002 AWPCA All-American (third team)



Megan Thomson became the first of five to earn All-America honors in Hartwick College's short water polo history.

In the Hawks' inaugural season, the native of Wellington, New Zealand was named an honorable mention American Water Polo Coaches Association All-American selection after posting 113 points (88 goals, 25 assists) in the program's first year. Her goal total ranked third in the nation.

A season later, she garnered 2002 second team AWPCA All-America accolades after pacing the Hawks with 121 points, including 94 goals (second in the country) in 35 matches. During her career, she was a two-time Collegiate Water Polo Association Northern Division Player of the Year as Hartwick captured back-to-back CWPA Northern Division and Region titles, along with the 2002 ECAC championship.

Thomson ended her career with 234 points in two years, which ranks fourth in school history. She was named the schools' Female Athlete of the Year in 2001 and again in 2002. Thomson also represented her native New Zealand at the 2001 FINA World Championships before her career ended. She was inducted into Hartwick's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002.

## Sheri Johnson

Sheri Johnson became the second Hartwick water polo player to garner All-American honors.

In 2003, she posted 73 points (55 goals, 18 assists) in only 28 games en route to earning Collegiate Water Polo Association Northern Division Player of the Year and honorable mention AWPCA All-America accolades.

The following year, Johnson was named a third team All-America honoree following her registering 103 points (85 goals, 18 as-

sists) in 41 contests.

She also garnered the 2004 Eastern Championships Most Valuable Player Award.

## Kate Chambers

2004 AWPCA All-American (third team)  
2005 AWPCA All-American (honorable mention)



Kate Chambers became the third All-America honoree in Hartwick history in 2004. Along with teammate Sheri Johnson, the native of Wellington, New Zealand, garnered third team American Water Polo Coaches Association All-America accolades after posting 108 points (58 goals, 50 assists).

In that year, she captured the first of two first team All-Northern Division and All-East honors. In her final year, Chambers increased her point total to 121 points (62 goals, 59 assists) in 35 games, en route to garnering

honorable mention AWPCA accolades.

She ended her career with 399 points, which stands as the all-time record for career points at Hartwick.

## Bronwyn Knox

2006 AWPCA All-American (second team)



The native of Brisbane, Australia garnered 2005 honorable mention American Water Polo Coaches Association All-America accolades as a true freshman in 2005 after putting up 133 points (102 goals, 31 assists).

In her first year, she also was a first team all-East and Collegiate Water Polo Association all-Northern Division honoree and was recognized as the Northern Division's Rookie of the Year.

Before leaving Hartwick to join the Australian National team following the 2006 campaign, Knox established new school records in points (153), goals (129) and steals (117) en route to being named the second team AWPCA All-American. Her 129 goals also led the nation.

In August, Knox led the Australian National team to a bronze medal at the Beijing Olympics. She finished the tournament with 12 goals which tied for third in the entire Olympic competition.

## Kirsten Hudson

As a freshman, Hudson led the Hawks to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships with a team-best 86 goals and 141 points. Her goal total ranked 10th in the country despite missing six games as she represented her native land at the World Championships. Her 141 points was the second highest point total at Hartwick.

Hudson netted five goals and an assist at the NCAA Tournament and garnered second team all-tournament honors.

Hudson was named the CWPA's Northern Division Player of the Year, the CWPA's Rookie of the Year, as well as the MVP of the CWPA's Eastern Championship.

In 2008, she became just the second player in program history to score over 100 goals in a season and the fourth player to record 300 or more career points. For the second straight year, she was tabbed the CWPA Northern Division Player of the Year and she earned AWPCA All-American honorable mention for the second time in two seasons.

Last season, Hudson became the first three-time All-American after her 124-goal, 77-assist season. She is the first player at Hartwick to break the 500-point barrier and the 300-goal mark in a career, and the first to surpass 200 points in a single season.

## Jessica McKee

2009 AWPCA All-American (honorable mention)



Jessica McKee is just the sixth Hartwick water polo player to garner All-American honors. In her two seasons with the Hawks, she has amassed 119 goals, 80 assists, 199 points, 75 steals, and 91 kick-outs drawn. Her 109 points in 2009 ranks 10th at Hartwick and she already ranks in the top 10 in career kick-outs drawn and 4/5-meter kickouts.

She was named to the CWPA Eastern Second Team and was selected to All-CWPA Northern Division First Team in 2009.

## Wick in the NCAA Tournament

Ever since adding water polo to its list of intercollegiate athletic programs in 2001, Hartwick has made three appearances in the NCAA Championships and all three have come in a five-year span.

The Hawks made their introductory trip to the NCAA Championships in 2004, after finishing the pre-NCAA event with 17 consecutive wins, which included defeating Michigan 5-2 in the CWPA Eastern title game. Hartwick took a 33-8 record to Palo Alto, California and the Avery Aquatic Center, where it dropped a pair of decisions to eventual national champion Southern California (12-4) and Stanford (12-2) en route to a fourth-place finish. Kate Chambers represented Hartwick with second team all-tournament honors.

After not winning the Eastern's automatic bid in 2005, the Hawks returned to the NCAA Tournament after once again downing then 16<sup>th</sup>-ranked Michigan (11-8) in the finals of the Eastern Championships. After dropping a 15-2 decision to fourth-ranked UCLA in the opening game, Hartwick rebounded and posted

its first victory at the NCAA Tournament with a convincing 14-5 decision over Marist. In the win, All-American Bronwen Knox scored six goals against the Red Foxes, which was an NCAA Tournament

record for goals in a single game. Vonya Thomas scored three goals, while Kim Sumich added seven helpers in the victory. The win set up a match-up against 10<sup>th</sup>-ranked UC Davis in the fifth-place game. Hartwick fell to the Aggies 12-10 in overtime as Knox posted four goals in defeat for the Hawks. Hartwick's season ended at 28-11.

Seeing that Knox, who netted 129 goals in 2006, left the program to train with the Australian National team for the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, 2007 was supposed to be a rebuilding season for Hartwick in the eyes of many. No one seemed to tell head coach Alan Huckins and his squad which posted a 32-10 mark and stormed past Harvard (16-1), Indiana (15-7) and Princeton (8-6) to once again gain the automatic berth. The Hawks dropped a 20-5 result to third-ranked Southern California, but rebounded nicely with 13-5 and 13-12 victories over Pomona-Pitzer and 7<sup>th</sup>-ranked Loyola Marymount to grab fifth-place, the highest finish by Hartwick since the tournament expanded to eight teams. In the victory over LMU, the Hawks recovered from an 11-5 deficit at the half and took the lead with just over 2:00 left in the final period on a goal by Sumich. Kirsten Hudson, who went on to garner honorable mention All-American honors, was recognized with second team all-tournament distinction.

## CWPA

Hartwick College is a member of the Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Conference.

After realignment in 2009, the CWPA has a total of 11 teams competing in three divisions. The Northern Division consists of three member institutions and the Southern Division and Western Division each will have four squads competing this season.

The top two teams in each division advancing to compete in the CWPA Eastern Championship. In addition, two at-large teams will be selected to compete in the tournament.

The winner of the CWPA Eastern Championship will receive the conference's automatic bid to compete in the 2010 NCAA Championship, which will

be played at the Aztec Aquaplex in San Diego, CA on May 14-16. Hartwick has won three of the last six automatic bids to the NCAA Championships.

The Hawks are joined in the Northern Division by Brown University and Harvard University. The three schools will compete in games during the regular season that will determine the CWPA Northern Division champion. The Hawks have won the title in each of the last nine seasons.

The teams making up the CWPA Southern Division are Bucknell University, George Washington University, University of Maryland and Princeton University. The four schools competing in the CWPA Western Division are Gannon University, Indiana University, Mercyhurst College, and the University of Michigan.
