



Fact Sheet 2010-11

Hartwick College is a private liberal arts and sciences college of 1,531 students, located in Oneonta, NY, in the northern foothills of the Catskill Mountains. Hartwick's expansive curriculum emphasizes a uniquely experiential approach to liberal arts. Through personalized teaching, collaborative research, a unique January Term, a wide range of internships and study-abroad opportunities, Hartwick ensures that students are prepared for the world ahead. A Three-Year Bachelor's Degree Program and strong financial aid and scholarship offerings keep a Hartwick education affordable.

STUDENTS

1,531 students come from 30 states and 22 countries; 41% male, 59% female; 12% ALANA (African-American, Hispanic, Asian-American, Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, and Native American); 3% international students; 69% New York State residents. 1,487 full-time students, with 42% male, 58% female, and 12% ALANA.

Three-year Degree Program: An accelerated program of study for 24 majors and allows the focused student to graduate in just three years. The program started in 2009. This year the College enrolled 30 students in the program and they join 19 returning students.

Junior/Senior Major Enrollments: Social Sciences 30%; Humanities 22%; Physical and Life Sciences 20%; Business and Accounting 17%; Nursing & Medical Technology 11%; Interdisciplinary <3%.

Student Organizations: More than 70 special interest student organizations are active on campus. Approximately 7% of students belong to Greek organizations, with two fraternities and three sororities.

Athletics: 404 (28%) students participate in one or more sports. Affiliation: NCAA Division III for most sports programs, Division I for men's soccer and women's water polo. Intercollegiate sports for women: basketball, cross-country, equestrian, field hockey, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, volleyball, water polo. Intercollegiate sports for men: basketball, cross-country, football, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis.

ACADEMICS

Majors: accounting (general & CPA), anthropology, art, art history, biochemistry, biology, chemistry, computer science, economics, English, environmental chemistry, French, geological and environmental sciences, German, history, information science, business administration, mathematics, medical technology, music, music education, nursing, philosophy, physics, political science, psychology, religious studies, sociology, Spanish, theatre arts. An Individual Student Program, a student-designed major, is offered for students whose interests lie outside an established major.

Minors: cognitive science, documentary photography, environmental science and policy, finance, graphic communications, Latin American and Caribbean studies, literature, museum studies, U.S. ethnic studies, women's and gender studies, writing. Minors also are available in almost all majors.

Special Programs: certification in elementary and secondary education, dual certification in childhood/special education and middle childhood and adolescence/special education, honors.

Pre-Professional Programs: pre-allied health professions, pre-engineering, pre-law, pre-medicine.

Cooperative Programs: engineering with Clarkson University and Columbia University; law with Albany Law School; MBA with Clarkson University and Union College; Partnership for Nursing Opportunities with Bassett Healthcare; physical and occupational therapy with Sage Graduate School.

FACULTY

187 faculty members, of which 104 are full-time; 96% of full-time faculty members hold the highest degree in their disciplines; student to faculty ratio 11.4:1.

OFF-CAMPUS STUDY/INSTITUTIONAL AFFILIATIONS: Hartwick students may be admitted to Oxford University's Harris Manchester College in England for year-long study, and Hartwick faculty may serve as Visiting Fellows for sabbatical study and lecturing. Other affiliations include: Philadelphia Center; The American University Washington Semester. Affiliated programs with some institutions including School for International Training; Central College Abroad; Syracuse University; Regent's College; National Outdoor Leadership Seminar; Institute for Study Abroad –Butler, AustraLearn, and International Studies Abroad.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY & RESOURCES

The campus network provides everyone with voice mail, phone, video, and wired and wireless Internet access. The College's main computers are Hewlett-Packard systems. The Language Lab has 24 multimedia stations. Hartwick's Stevens-German Library utilizes technology and the Internet to provide Hartwick students, faculty, and staff with a wide range of information and learning resources. The Library's collection includes more than 385,000 books, serial backfiles, and other paper materials; 160 serial subscriptions; 50,000 microforms; 4,500 audio-visual materials; and 4,000 e-books.

RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

82% of Hartwick students live in College on-campus housing. Housing options include traditional residence halls, suites, and townhouse apartments. 34 additional students live at the College's Pine Lake Environmental Campus, located eight miles from main campus.

GRADUATES & ALUMNI/AE

Within six months of graduation, more than 96% of the students either are employed or enrolled in graduate or professional school, or in services (military, Peace Corps, etc.).
