ELIGIBILITY

Students with a 3.0 or above may apply for a Scholarship for International Study at any time as long as they are in good standing at the College and have no holds on their student account. There may be additional requirements placed by specific programs or host institutions. Projects involving research of human subjects may require approval by the Hartwick Institutional Review Board before any funding can be released to the scholarship winner. Students on disciplinary probation may not qualify, depending upon the violation. Students who apply for an award must demonstrate that they are able to be flexible and adapt to new environments, are able to assume responsibility for their own medical and psychological needs, and are mature enough to respect their host culture as well as any fellow program participants.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

Students must submit a 750-word personal statement with their application. They should:

- describe their international study program or project/internship, relating their program goals to their academic goals
- include why they want to go abroad, why they have chosen this particular course or project and its location
- explain what this program means to them personally and professionally
- answer this question: how do you think this experience will enable you to change the world?
- address why they are requesting financial assistance
- indicate how they propose to share their experience with the campus community upon return

Applicants must show an acceptance to the program or organization abroad, if applicable.

OTHER REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

All applicants must present a recommendation letter of support by the faculty who will lead the off-campus course or from their advisor who approves the study abroad coursework or supervises the project/internship. Students should take the original of the application to the Center for Interdependence in Golisano Hall by the indicated deadline.
