Blue Trail, spanning 2.2 miles, is the primary circuit of the trail system. While it offers captivating scenery, it can present occasional challenges due to its elevation. The path meanders through both pine and deciduous woodlands, encompassing the iconic Table Rock overlook. This route delves into the trail's historic segments, including ancient forests and former log routes leading to Strawberry Field. It gracefully intersects the road to Strawberry Field on two occasions and loops along the system's most exquisite ridge trails.



**Yellow Trail,** covering 2.0 miles, is the secondary loop, partially coinciding with the Blue Trail. Similar to its counterpart, it can prove demanding at times. This trail ventures through pine and deciduous forests, tracing the contours of the upper and lower forest ridges. It, too, grants passage over the renowned Table Rock overlook.



Red Trail Spur, extending 1.0 mile, serves as an intermediary between the Blue and Yellow Trails. Regarded as a relatively effortless section, this stretch follows an antiquated logging road, crosses the former road leading to Strawberry Field, and links with a newly established spur, created in 2018, that connects with the lower ridge segment of the Blue Trail. This trail is for hiking only.
